

Fisheries (Amendment) Bill 2012
Third Reading approved

Mr Turner: Do I need to suspend – ?

The President: I think we did suspend for the purpose of the whole process, so we will carry on with the Third Reading, Hon. Member.

Mr Turner: Thank you, Madam President.

Again, I thank Members for their support in taking these provisions through.

This Bill, as I said, makes two amendments which we have discussed this morning, to the Fisheries Act 2012. It introduces the defence into section 28, where possession of certain items near a river are permitted in certain circumstances; and to provide for independent scrutiny, where items are forfeited under the Act that are to be disposed of.

I beg to move that the Bill be read a third time and do pass.

Mr Downie: I beg to second, Madam President, and reserve my remarks.
