

**5.2. Terrorism and Other Crime (Financial Restrictions) Bill 2014 –
Third Reading approved**

Mr Watterson to move:

That the Terrorism and Other Crime (Financial Restrictions) Bill 2014 be read the third time.

The Speaker: The Terrorism and Other Crime (Financial Restrictions) Bill. Again, I call on Mr Watterson.

Mr Watterson: Mr Speaker, the principle and purpose behind this Bill was debated during the Second Reading.

During the clauses stage last week, the long title of the Bill was amended to enable two clauses to be inserted to the Bill to correct a minor drafting error in the current Criminal Justice, Police Powers and Other Amendments Bill relating to bail.

Mr Houghton mentioned other issues concerning bail, and I will write to him very shortly regarding that.

No other issues were raised in relation to the Bill, and I therefore beg to move that the Third Reading of the Terrorism and Other Crime (Financial Restrictions) Bill be approved.
