

**3. Airports and Civil Aviation (Amendment) Bill 2018 –  
Third Reading approved**

Mr Crookall to move:

*That the Airports and Civil Aviation (Amendment) Bill 2018 be read a third time and do pass.*

**The President:** We turn to Airports and Civil Aviation (Amendment) Bill for Third Reading. Again, I call Mr Crookall.

**Mr Crookall:** Thank you, Mr President.

In moving the Third Reading, I would like to thank Hon. Members who have contributed to the debate on this Bill and for their support. As previously outlined, the Bill will allow the Island to make its own civil aviation secondary legislation utilising international and domestic standards without the need to extend legislation from elsewhere or to rely on the UK government to make orders on our behalf.
