

**7. Ecclesiastical Committee of Tynwald –
Second Report 2018-19: Draft Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and
Care of Churches Measure (Isle of Man) received and recommendation approved**

The Chair of the Ecclesiastical Committee of Tynwald (Mr Cannan) to move:

That the Second Report for the Session 2018-2019 – Draft Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and Care of Churches Measure (Isle of Man) [[PP No 2018/0176](#)] be received and the following recommendation be approved:

That the draft Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and Care of Churches Measure (Isle of Man) [[PP 2018/0176A](#)] in the form laid before Tynwald be presented to Her Majesty for Her Royal Assent, as required by Schedule 1 to the Church Legislation Procedure Act 1993.

The Chair of the Ecclesiastical Committee of Tynwald (Mr Cannan): Thank you, Mr President. Hon. Members, the members of the Ecclesiastical Committee of Tynwald are Mrs Beecroft, Mrs Maska and myself. We met on 10th December 2018 with members of the Legislative Committee of the Sodor and Man Diocesan Synod to consider the draft Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and Care of Churches Measure (Isle of Man) before you. The objective of the draft Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and Care of Churches Measure is to extend to the Isle of Man, with modifications, Parts 1 and 3 to 6 of the Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction and Care of Churches Measure 2018.

A full explanatory memorandum about the draft Measure can be found at Appendix 2 in the report that has been put before you.

Your Committee has considered the draft Measure and recommend that it should be given Tynwald approval today and then presented to Her Majesty the Queen in the same manner as a Bill, and have the force and effect of an Act of Tynwald that requires Royal Assent.
