1. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Dr Haywood) to ask the Chief Minister –

Whether the Chief Minister is satisfied that the conditions supporting the endemic approach to living with Covid are still being met; and if he will make a statement.

2. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Mr Speaker) to ask the Chief Minister –

Why the Climate Change Plan 2022-27 has not been put on the Register of Business or on the Order Paper for the July 2022 sitting of Tynwald in Douglas.

3. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for the Treasury –

Whether maternity and child support payments will be reviewed before the Budget in 2023.

4. The Hon. Member for Garff (Mrs Caine) to ask the Minister for the Treasury –

What progress has been made since March 2021 with extending the FloodRE Scheme to the Island.

5. The Hon. Member for Garff (Mrs Caine) to ask the Minister for the Treasury –
What plans Treasury has to continue supporting Laxey Glen Mills Limited.
6. The Hon. Member for Douglas North (Mr Ashford) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –
What progress has been made with the implementation of an Additional Educational Needs Code.
7. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Glover) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –
Why off-Island consultants have been appointed to conduct the review of swimming pools.
8. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –
When her Department last considered the importance of school uniform policy and the impact of school uniform costs on family budgets.
9. The Hon. Member for Garff (Mrs Caine) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –
What progress has been made with Laxey Wheel restoration; when it will re-open; what further work will be required; and if he will make a statement.
10. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Dr Haywood) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –
Whether the Green Living Grant scheme assessment software supports the removal of fossil fuel boilers and their replacement with low carbon alternatives.
11. The Hon. Member for Douglas North (Mr Ashford) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –
What engagement his Department has had with businesses, and what support is being provided, to ensure customers can both access and use cash for purchases.
12. The Hon. Member for Garff (Mrs Caine) to ask the Minister for Environment, Food and Agriculture –
What her Department's plan is to secure on-Island flour production.

13. The Hon. Member for Douglas North (Mr Ashford) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

What plans there are to upgrade and expand respite facilities.

14. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Mr Speaker) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

How many full time equivalent (a) doctors and (b) nurses are in permanent employment within Noble's Hospital; what the expected establishment level is based on workforce planning and budget; what plans he has to improve the situation; and what his timetable is for doing so.

15. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Mr Speaker) to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

On how many occasions during 2022 Noble's Hospital has been unable to fully meet safe staffing levels as issued by the Nursing and Midwifery Council; what plans he has to improve the situation; and what his timetable is for doing so.

16. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What progress has been made towards implementation of the Landlord Registration (Private Housing) Act 2021.

17. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

If he will make a statement on the closure of the airport on 16th June 2022.

18. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What Bus Vannin's policy is on the provision of minibus services; whether drivers receive additional training for this; and what private hire services have been available from Bus Vannin since 1st April 2022.

19. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for the Cabinet Office –

What support will be made available to families in receipt of free school meals during the 2022 summer holiday period.

20. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Mr Speaker) to ask the Minister for the Cabinet Office –

For how much longer Covid-19 surveillance reports will be produced; how accurately reported positive test results reflect numbers of cases in the community; and whether there is any change in guidance during the current spike in cases.

21. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for the Cabinet Office –

Whether the community infrastructure levy is still being progressed.

22. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for the Treasury –

Whether the value of the assets which a person can retain when receiving financial support from the Government will be reassessed ahead of the 2023 Budget.

23. The Hon. Member of the Council, Mr Henderson, to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

Further to the Answers given by her predecessor in Tynwald on 15th June 2021, what action has been taken to prevent unnecessary running of vehicle engines in schools and in other places where young people gather.

24. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Dr Haywood) to ask the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture –

Whether she considers that there are sufficient laptops or iPads in her Department's primary schools; and what her Department's policy is on the provision and renewal of laptops and iPads in its primary schools.

25. The Hon. Member for Middle (Mr Peters) to ask the Minister for Enterprise –

How many jobs are to be lost at West Atlantic Aviation Maintenance, and when, and why; how many jobs will remain; and if he will make a statement.

26. The Hon. Member for Garff (Mrs Caine) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What progress has been made with the re-installation of the Douglas Bay Horse Tramway track; when trams will start to operate; and if he will make a statement.

27. The Hon. Member for Rushen (Dr Haywood) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What his Department's policy is on publicly accessible bring banks for plastic bottle recycling; and how he plans to increase the level of plastic bottle recycling.

What data is being collected about the number of people contracting Covid-19 more than once, and about the impact of repeatedly contracting the virus.

30. The Hon. Member of the Council, Mr Henderson, to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

Further to the answer given by his predecessor in Tynwald on 15th June 2021, what progress has been made towards establishing and enforcing a Government-wide policy against the unnecessary running of vehicle engines on publicly owned property.

31. The Hon. Member of the Council, Mr Henderson, to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What the maximum sentence is for a driver who, through an act of dangerous driving, kills another person; and whether there are any plans to review this in line with section 86(2) of the UK's Police, Crime, Sentencing and Courts Act 2022.

32. The Hon. Member of the Council, Mr Henderson, to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

Whether he has any plans to review policy and legislation pertaining to motorised vehicle use on public rights of way, with particular reference to pedestrian safety.

33. The Hon. Member of the Council, Mr Henderson, to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

Whether he has any plans to review policy and legislation relating to the use of greenways and upland public rights of way by motorised vehicles, with particular reference to environmental factors.

34. The Hon. Member for Garff (Mrs Caine) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What flood defence work has been completed in Laxey; what remains to be done; and if he will make a statement.

35. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

How many tenants in public sector housing have been refused a renewal of a five-year fixed term tenancy agreement in each of the last five years based on a) the maximum income level having exceeded; and b) other factors.

36. The Hon. Member for Middle (Mr Peters) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What assessment has been made of the impact on traffic of the additional homes proposed for Braddan a) when the Mountain Course is closed and b) at other times; and what plans his Department has to create additional access roads.

37. The Hon. Member of the Council, Mr Henderson, to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

Why a person aged 66 or over is required to pay more per year, on average, to renew their driving licence than a person aged 65 or under; and what plans he has to review the charging mechanism for driving licence renewals.

38. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What factors led to the planned work along the A5 being suspended until further notice.

39. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew (Mr Moorhouse) to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

When the new roundabout on the A5 and the surrounding area will be completed; and when the area opposite the new estate will be returned to its former standard of finish.

Further to written answer W-202201-0240, given on 7th July 2022, when the Island-wide Shoreline Management Plan will be completed; and to what extent it will differ from existing plans to address coastal erosion at Kirk Michael.
