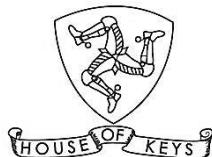

1. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew, Mr Moorhouse, to ask the Chief Minister –

Further to the answer given by the Minister for Education, Sport and Culture in Tynwald on 18th October 2022, on which dates the Council of Ministers has considered the external report on swimming pool provision; and when the report will be published.

2. The Hon. Member for Douglas North, Mr Ashford, to ask the Minister for the Treasury –

What consideration has been given to extending the repayment time for COVID business loans underwritten by the Government under the Disruption Loan Guarantee Agreements and the Business Working Capital Loan Agreements; and if he will make a statement.

3. The Hon. Member for Douglas North, Mr Ashford, to ask the Minister for the Treasury –

What plans there are to simplify the Disability Living Allowance application process.

4. The Hon. Member for Arbory, Castletown and Malew, Mr Moorhouse, to ask the Minister for Health and Social Care –

When the introduction of a fee for parking at the hospital was last discussed.

5. The Hon. Member for Rushen, Dr Haywood, to ask the Minister for Infrastructure –

What emergency protocols are in place to prevent damage to vessels in the harbours at Douglas and Peel should the flapgates fail; how long it takes to enact emergency measures to prevent water drainage; what risk analysis been carried out into the relocation of the stop logs for Peel; and what the cost of the recent changes in Peel was.

On how many occasions since the start of the school year in September 2022 school bus capacity has been reached, and on which routes.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 14

1. Page 23, lines 28 to 40, and page 24, lines 1 to 13: for the existing text substitute the following —

«14 **Disclosure of information from the Animal Welfare Register by the Department when responding to external requests**

IOM2017/3/28 & IOM2019/6/40 & IOM1970/3/106D and drafting

- (1) The Department, in response to a request made by an authorised body in such manner and form as the Department may require, may disclose to the authorised body information recorded in the Animal Welfare Register if the Department is satisfied that —

- (a) the request is made in furtherance of the functions of the authorised body; and
(b) the making of the disclosure is proportionate to what is sought to be achieved by it.

- (2) Nothing in this Act authorises a disclosure, in contravention of the provisions of the data protection legislation, of personal data which is not exempt from those provisions.

- (3) In this section —

“authorised body” means —

- (a) an inspector who is not employed by the Department;
(b) the Animal and Plant Health Agency, an executive agency of the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs;

“data protection legislation” has the meaning given in regulation 5(1) of the GDPR and LED Implementing Regulations 2018.

- (4) The Department may by order amend the definition of “authorised body”.

AMENDMENT TO CLAUSE 18

2. Page 26, lines 33 to 36, for the existing text substitute the following —
 - «(9) When exercising its power under subsection (1), (2) or (3), the court may order payment to P of an amount of compensation it considers suitable if satisfied that such payment would be appropriate in the circumstances.».
