The remit of the Committee is set out in Standing Order 6.5:

The Management and Members' Standards Committee shall –

(1) consider and report on any matter which concerns the business, precincts or facilities of the House which is not within the remit of any other Committee of the House or the Speaker alone;

(2) represent the House in all matters brought before any chambers of the Legislature other than legislation, and to report thereon from time to time to the House;

(3) consider and report upon any matter that may from time to time be referred to the Committee by the House, or by a Member, which relates to the conduct of a Member;

(4) consider and report on such standards and such privileges of the House and of Members as have been, or in the future should be, recognised as necessary and desirable for the proper and effective discharge of the duties of the House and its Members.

The powers, privileges and immunities relating to the work of a committee of Tynwald are those conferred by sections 3 and 4 of the Tynwald Proceedings Act 1876, sections 1 to 4 of the Privileges of Tynwald (Publications) Act 1973 and sections 2 to 4 of the Tynwald Proceedings Act 1984.

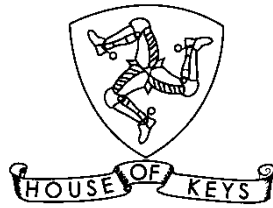

REPORT OF THE HOUSE OF KEYS MANAGEMENT AND MEMBERS' STANDARDS COMMITTEE FIRST REPORT FOR THE SESSION 2016-2017

I. THE CHAPLAIN OF THE HOUSE

1. Following the election of a new House, the Committee met to consider nominations by Members for the appointment of a Chaplain. We considered two matters: whom to recommend for appointment and the honorarium.

Appointment of the Chaplain

2. Standing Order 9.4.1(i) provides that "Immediately following the election of the Management and Members' Standards Committee, the Speaker shall call for nominations for Chaplain of the House to be submitted to that Committee". The Speaker duly did so on Tuesday 25th October.
3. Standing Order 9.4.1(ii) provides that "The Management and Members' Standards Committee shall report to the House on the nominations with a recommendation." Standing Order 9.4.1(iii) provides that "The House, on considering the report of the Committee, shall appoint a Chaplain to serve for the life of the House."
4. Since then the Committee received two nominations, only one of which was pursued, as one candidate was unable to serve: following previous practice, we do not publish the names of those nominated. We regard this information as confidential.

5. We recommend the appointment of the Venerable Andrew Brown, Archdeacon of Sodor and Man, whose curriculum vitae is at Appendix 1.

Honorarium

6. Standing Order 9.4.2 provides that “The Management and Members’ Standards Committee shall recommend the honorarium to be paid to the Chaplain of the House and report their recommendations to the House for approval.” We understand that the Archdeacon does not wish to take an honorarium and in view of the fact that he is still salaried, rather than retired, we do not recommend that he be paid one.
7. At Appendix 2, for Members’ information, is a list of the Chaplains of the House in modern times.

Recommendation

The Committee accordingly recommends that the Venerable Andrew Brown be elected Chaplain of the House to serve during the life of this House.
