FOOD AND DRUGS ACT 1963

BOVINE OFFAL (PROHIBITION) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1995

Approved by Tynwald ^{*and*} *March 1995*

Coming into operation 1st April 1995

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Local Government and the Environment by section 14 and 69 of the Food and Drugs Act 1963(a), and of all other enabling powers, after consulting such organisations as appear to it to be representative of interests substantially affected by the Regulations, the following Regulations are hereby made:-

Title and commencement

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Bovine Offal (Prohibition) (Amendment) Regulations 1995 and, subject to section 70 of the Food and Drugs Act 1963, shall come into operation on 1st April 1995.

Amendments

2.(1) The Bovine Offal (Prohibition) Regulations 1990 (b) shall be amended in accordance with this regulation.

(2) In regulations 2 (1) (Interpretation); for the definition of "specified bovine offal" there shall be substituted the following:-

"Specified bovine offal" means -


- (a) where the animal is over 6 months of age and has died or been slaughtered in the Island or the United Kingdom, the brain, spinal cord, spleen, thymus, tonsils and intestines;
- (b) where the animal is 2 months of age or over but not over 6 months of age and has died or been slaughtered in the Island or the United Kingdom, the thymus and intestines only; and
- (c) where the animal is under 2 months of age and has been slaughtered in the Island or the United Kingdom, the thymus and intestines only;"

(3) In regulations 3 (1) (Exemptions) paragraph (1) is revoked.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the Bovine Offal (Prohibition) Regulations 1990 so as to extend the controls on certain specified bovine offal to such offal derived from animals aged six months or under.
