THE NATIONAL HEALTH SERVICE (ISLE OF MAN)(GENERAL MEDICAL AND PHARMACEUTICAL SERVICES)(AMENDMENT)(NO. 2) REGULATIONS 1995

Approved by Tynwald on 16th May 1995

Coming into operation on 1st June 1995

In exercise of the powers conferred on the Department of Health and Social Security by sections 27, 33 and 34 of the National Health Service (Isle of Man) Act 1948(a) and of all other enabling powers, and after consultation with the Health Services Advisory Council, the following regulations are hereby made:-

Citation, Commencement and Interpretation

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the National Health Service (Isle of Man)(General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services)(Amendment)(No. 2) Regulations, 1995, and shall come into operation on 1st June 1995.

(2) In these Regulations, "the principal Regulations" means the National Health Service (Isle of Man)(General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) Regulations, 1978.(b)

Amendment of Principal Regulations

2. (1) Schedule 1 to the principal Regulations (terms of service for doctors) is amended as follows.

(2) In paragraph 30 (which prohibits a doctor from charging a fee except for the services listed in that paragraph), at the end there is inserted -


"(1.) for prescribing or providing drugs for malaria chemoprophylaxis"

(3) In paragraph 31A (which says that a doctor may not charge for prescriptions) for "and 36" there is substituted ",(1) and 36".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Regulations)

These Regulations amend the National Health Service (General Medical and Pharmaceutical Services) Regulations 1978 ("the principal Regulations) which regulate the terms on which doctors provide general medical services under the National Health Service (Isle of Man) Act 1948.

Regulation 2 amends doctors' terms of service to add providing or prescribing drugs against developing malaria to the list of services for which a doctor may charge a fee.
