SOCIAL SECURITY BENEFITS UPRATING ORDER 2013

Approved by Tynwald: 19 March 2013
Coming into Operation: 8 April 2013

The Department of Social Care makes the following Order under sections 150B(4), 150BG(5) and 175 of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992¹ and sections 150(1)(a), (aa), (e), (ea), (g) and (h) and (2)(b) and 189 of the Social Security Administration Act 1992² as those Acts of Parliament have effect in the Island³.

PART I – INTRODUCTION

1 Title

This Order is the Social Security Benefits Uprating Order 2013.

2 Commencement

If approved by Tynwald, and subject to article 15, this Order comes into operation on 8 April 2013⁴.

3 Interpretation

(1) In this Order –

“**the Contributions and Benefits Act**” means the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992;

“**the Employed Person’s Allowance Regulations**” means the Employed Person’s Allowance (General) Regulations 2011⁵;

“**the Income Support Regulations**” means the Income Support (General) (Isle of Man) Regulations 2000⁶; and

“the **Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations**” means the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations 1996⁷.

- (2) Unless the context otherwise requires or it is expressly provided —
- (a) a reference in this Order to a provision of any such legislation or of any other legislation applied to the Island by an order under section 1 or 1A of the Security Act 2000 is a reference to that legislation as it has effect in the Island; and
 - (b) words and expressions appearing in this Order are to be construed according to the Interpretation Act 1978 (of Parliament)⁸.

PART II — INCOME SUPPORT AND EMPLOYED PERSON’S ALLOWANCE

4 Applicable amounts for income support

- (1) The sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount as specified in the Income Support Regulations shall be the sums set out in the following provisions of this article and Schedules 1 to 7 to this Order; and for this purpose references in this article to a numbered regulation or Schedule are, unless the context otherwise requires, references to the regulation of, or the Schedule to, the Income Support Regulations bearing that number.
- (2) In regulation 17ZA(3)⁹ (claimants residing in Part III accommodation other than by reason of their age) —
- (a) in sub-paragraph (a) for “£111.00”¹⁰ substitute “£120.00”; and
 - (b) in sub-paragraph (b) for “£222.00”¹¹ substitute “£240.00”.
- (3) The sums specified in Part I of Schedule 2 (personal allowances) shall be as set out in Schedule 1 to this Order.
- (4) The sums specified in paragraph 20(6) and (6A) in Part IV of Schedule 2 (disabled child and shared care premiums) shall be as set out in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- (5) The sums specified in the Table in Part I and in Part II of Schedule 3 (housing costs) shall be as set out in Schedule 3 to this Order.
- (6) The sums specified in Schedule 4 (persons in residential accommodation) shall be as set out in Schedule 4 to this Order.

- (7) The sums specified in Schedule 4A (board and lodgings) shall be as set out in Schedule 5 to this Order.
- (8) The sums specified in Schedule 4B (persons with a mental or physical disability or illness living in certain accommodation free of charge) shall be as set out in Schedule 6 to this Order.
- (9) The sums specified in paragraphs 18 and 19 of Schedule 5 (special cases) shall be as set out in Schedule 7 to this Order.
- (10) In Schedule 7 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings) in paragraph 27¹² (payments made to the claimant under contractual liability in respect of the occupation of the claimant's home by another person) —
 - (a) in sub-paragraph (a) for “£5.95” substitute “£6.00”; and
 - (b) in sub-paragraph (b) for “£13.75” substitute “£13.90”.

5 The relevant sum for income support

In section 126(7) of the Contributions and Benefits Act (trade disputes) the substituted sum is £39.90¹³.

6 Employed person's allowance

- (1) The sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount as specified in the Employed Person's Allowance Regulations shall be the sums set out in the following provisions of this article and Schedules 8 to 10 to this Order; and for this purpose references in this article to a numbered regulation or Schedule are, unless the context otherwise requires, references to the regulation of, or the Schedule to, the Employed Person's Allowance Regulations bearing that number.
- (2) In Schedule 3 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings) —
 - (a) in paragraph 22(1) (maintenance payments) for “£23.70”¹⁴ substitute “£23.95”; and
 - (b) in paragraph 33¹⁵ (payments made to the claimant under contractual liability in respect of the occupation of the claimant's home by another person) —
 - (i) in sub-paragraph (a) for “£5.95” substitute “£6.00”; and
 - (ii) in sub-paragraph (b) for “£13.75” substitute “£13.90”.
- (3) In Schedule 5 (relevant child care charges), the applicable amounts shall be as set out in Schedule 8 to this Order.

- (4) In Schedule 6 (housing costs), the applicable amounts shall be as set out in Schedule 9 to this Order.
- (5) In Schedule 7 (applicable amounts for adults, children and young persons), the applicable amounts shall be as set out in Schedule 10 to this Order.

PART III – INCOME-BASED JOBSEEKER’S ALLOWANCE

7 Applicable amounts for jobseeker’s allowance

- (1) The sums relevant to the calculation of an applicable amount as specified in the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations shall be the sums set out in the following provisions of this article and Schedules 11 to 17 to this Order; and for this purpose, references in this article to a numbered regulation or Schedule are, unless the context otherwise requires, references to a regulation of, or a Schedule to, the Jobseeker’s Allowance Regulations bearing that number.
- (2) The sums specified in Schedule 1 (personal allowances) shall be as set out in Schedule 11 to this Order.
- (3) The sums specified in the Table in Part II and in Part III of Schedule 2 (housing costs) shall be as set out in Schedule 12 to this Order.
- (4) The sums specified in –
 - (a) paragraph 20(6) and (6A) in the Table in Part III; and
 - (b) paragraph 20M(4B) in the Table in Part IIIB,of Schedule 3 (weekly amounts of premiums) shall be as set out in Schedule 13 to this Order.
- (5) The sums specified in Schedule 4 (persons in residential care and nursing homes) shall be as set out in shall be as set out in Schedule 14 to this Order.
- (6) The sums specified in Schedule 4A (board and lodgings) shall be as set out in Schedule 15 to this Order.
- (7) The sums specified in Schedule 4B (persons with a mental or physical disability or illness living in certain accommodation free of charge) shall be as set out in Schedule 16 to this Order.
- (8) The sums specified in paragraph 16A of Schedule 5 (special cases) shall be as set out in Schedule 17 to this Order.
- (9) In Schedule 7 (sums to be disregarded in the calculation of income other than earnings) in paragraph 26¹⁶ (payments made to the claimant under

8 Amount for funeral expenses

In regulation 11¹⁷ of the Maternity and Funeral Expenses (General) (Isle of Man) Regulations 2007¹⁸ (amount of additional funeral payment) —

- (a) in paragraph (3) —
 - (i) in sub-paragraph (g) for “£86” substitute “£88”;
 - (ii) in sub-paragraph (h) for “£49” substitute “£50”; and
 - (iii) in sub-paragraph (i) for “£1,035” substitute “£1,064”; and
- (b) in paragraph (7)(b) —
 - (i) for “£1,035” substitute “£1,064”; and
 - (ii) for “£161” substitute “£166”.

PART V — RETIREMENT PENSION PREMIUM

9 Rate of retirement pension premium

The rate of the retirement pension premium specified in paragraph 5(1) of the Retirement Pension (Premium) Scheme 2002¹⁹ shall be £15.55²⁰.

PART VI — WINTER BONUSES

10 Amount of winter bonus

The amount of winter bonus specified for the purposes of section 150B(4)²¹ of the Contributions and Benefits Act in relation to 2014 shall be —

- (a) £300, in the case of a person who qualifies for a bonus by virtue of section 150B(3)(a)(i) of that Act; and

- (b) zero, in the case of a person who qualifies for a bonus by virtue of section 150B(3)(a)(ii) of that Act.

11 Amount of additional winter bonus

The amount of additional winter bonus specified for the purposes of section 150B(4) of the Contributions and Benefits Act in respect of 2014 shall be zero.

12 Amounts of variable rate winter bonus

For the purposes of section 150BG(5)²² of the Contributions and Benefits Act, in respect of 2014—

- (a) the maximum variable rate winter bonus shall be £300; and
(b) the minimum variable rate winter bonus shall be £10.

PART VII — MATERNITY ALLOWANCE

13 Rate of maternity allowance

In Part I of Schedule 4 to the Contributions and Benefits Act (rates of contributory periodical benefits), in paragraph 4(b) (maternity allowance: self-employed earners), in column 2 (weekly rate of benefit) for “£135.45”²³ substitute “£136.78”.

PART VIII — NURSING CARE CONTRIBUTION

14 Amount of nursing care contribution

In paragraph 7²⁴ of the Nursing Care Contribution Scheme 2008²⁵ (amount of nursing care contribution) —

- (a) in sub-paragraph (a) for “£100.00” substitute “£110.00”; and
(b) in sub-paragraph (b) for “£14.29” substitute “£15.71”.

PART IX – TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS AND REVOCATION

15 Transitional provisions

In the case of a person whose period of award of employed person's allowance has not ended before 8 April 2013, article 6 shall come into operation on the day immediately following the day that period of award ends.

16 Revocation

The Social Security Benefits Up-rating Order 2012²⁶ is revoked.

This Order is made (in particular) under sections 150B and 150BG of the Social Security Contributions and Benefits Act 1992 and section 150 of the Social Security Administration Act 1992 (as those Acts of the United Kingdom Parliament have effect in the Isle of Man) and includes details of the sums mentioned in those sections taking effect from 8 April 2013.

Part I (articles 1, 2 and 3) relates to the title, commencement and interpretation of the Order.

Part II relates to income support and employed person's allowance.

Article 4 states the amount of sums relevant to the applicable amount for the purposes of income support. Article 4(2) provides the relevant amounts for persons whose residential accommodation is provided pursuant to Part III of the National Assistance (Isle of Man) Act 1951 for reasons other than their age. Article 4(3) and Schedule 1 set out the rates of personal allowances. Article 4(4) and Schedule 2 set out the disabled child and shared care premiums. Article 4(5) and Schedule 3 set out the relevant amounts in respect of housing costs. Article 4(6) and Schedule 4 set out the relevant amounts for persons in residential accommodation. Article 4(7) and Schedule 5 set out the relevant amounts for persons in board and lodgings. Article 4(8) and Schedule 6 set out the relevant amounts for persons with a mental or physical disability or illness living in certain accommodation free of charge. Article 4(9) and Schedule 7 set out the applicable amounts for certain persons in residential accommodation who become patients and for lone parents incurring relevant child care charges in education or undergoing training. Article 4(10) sets out the income disregards for income support in the case of payments made to the claimant under contractual liability in respect of the occupation of the claimant's home by another person.

Article 5 states the sum which a person involved in a trade dispute is deemed to receive for the purpose of calculating entitlement to income support.

Article 6 states the amount of sums relevant to the applicable amounts for the purposes of employed person's allowance. Article 6(2) sets out the income disregards for employed person's allowance in the case of maintenance payments payable to the claimant or the claimant's partner and payments made to the claimant under contractual liability in respect of the occupation of the claimant's home by another person. Article 6(3) and Schedule 8 set out the applicable amounts of relevant child care charges. Article 6(4) and Schedule 9 set out the applicable amounts for housing costs. Article 6(5) and Schedule 10 set out the applicable amounts for employed person's allowance in respect of adults, children and young persons.

Part III relates to income-based jobseeker's allowance.

Article 7 states the amount of sums relevant to the applicable amount for the purposes of income-based jobseeker's allowance. Article 7(2) and Schedule 11 set out the rates of personal allowances. Article 7(3) and Schedule 12 set out the relevant amounts in respect of housing costs. Article 7(4) and Schedule 13 set out the disabled child and minority care premiums in the case of persons claiming income-based jobseeker's allowance and the minority care premium for persons claiming a joint-claim jobseeker's allowance. Article 7(5) and Schedule 14 set out the amounts relevant amounts for persons in residential accommodation. Article 7(6) and Schedule 15 set out the relevant amounts for persons living in board and lodgings accommodation. Article 7(7) and Schedule 16 set out the amounts relevant to persons with a mental or physical disability or illness living in certain accommodation free of charge. Article 7(8) and Schedule 17 set out the applicable amounts for certain lone parents incurring relevant child care charges in education or undergoing training. Part IV relates to funeral expenses.

Article 8 specifies the maximum amount of miscellaneous funeral expenses to be included in any means-tested additional funeral payment. It also specifies the maximum amounts payable for Minister's and organist's fees.

Part V relates to the retirement pension premium.

Article 9 specifies the maximum rate of retirement pension premium payable.

Part VI relates to the 3 winter bonuses.

Article 10 specifies the amount of Winter Bonus payable in 2014. Article 11 specifies that the amount of Additional Winter Bonus payable in 2014 shall be zero. Article 12 specifies the maximum and minimum amounts of Variable Rate Winter Bonus payable in 2014.

Part VII relates to maternity allowance.

Article 13 specifies the standard rate of maternity allowance for self-employed earners.

Part VIII specifies the daily and weekly amounts of nursing care contribution.

Part IX relates to transitional provisions and revocations.

Article 15 makes transitional provision in relation to article 6 in the case of persons whose period of award of employed person's allowance has not ended before 8 April 2013. Article 16 revokes the Order relating to the uprating of benefits from 9 April 2012.
