SOCIAL SECURITY LEGISLATION (BENEFITS) (APPLICATION) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 2013

Approved by Tynwald: 19 March 2013
Coming into Operation: 1 April 2013

The Department of Social Care makes the following Order under section 1A of the Social Security Act 2000.

1 Title

This Order is the Social Security Legislation (Benefits) (Application) (Amendment) Order 2013.

2 Commencement

If approved by Tynwald, this Order comes into operation on 1 April 2013.

3 Interpretation

In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires or it is expressly provided —

- (a) a reference to a provision of any legislation applied to the Island by an order under section 1 or 1A of the Security Act 2000 is a reference to the provision of that legislation as it has effect in the Island; and
- (b) words and expressions appearing in it are to be construed according to the Interpretation Act 1978 (of Parliament)¹.

4 Amendment of the Social Security Administration Act 1992 (Application) Order 1994

- (1) The Schedule to the Social Security Administration Act 1992 (Application) Order 1994² is amended as follows.

- (2) In section 163³ of the Social Security Administration Act 1992⁴ (general financial arrangements)—
- (a) in subsection (1) after paragraph (a) insert—
- (aa) carer's allowance;²² and
- (b) in subsection (2)(b) after “other than” insert ²²carer's allowance,²².

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This note is not part of the Order)

This Order provides for the change in the method of funding of carer's allowance.

Articles 1 to 3 contain the Order's title, commencement and interpretation provisions.

Article 4 amends the Order which applied the Social Security Administration Act 1992 to the Island to provide that carer's allowance is no longer to be funded out of money provided by Tynwald but instead is to be funded from the Manx National Insurance Fund.
